TREND #1: Fragmentation Magnifies Complexity

TREND #3: More State Regulations Follow the CCPA

In 2018, California passed the California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA), a state privacy statute modeled in part on the EU's GDPR.

CCPA WENT INTO EFFECT ON JANUARY 1, 2020,

and several states have followed suit with more rigorous privacy laws.

TREND #4: NAIC Model Laws Continue to Add Complexity in Insurance and Financial Sectors

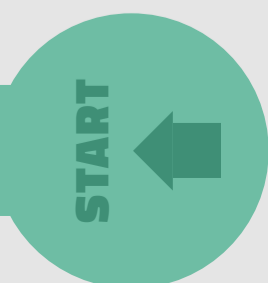
In 2017, in response to a number of **Data Breaches** in the insurance industry, the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) published a model law for insurance data security.
